## Highlight

January is a great time to reflect on successes and challenges of the previous year. In 2023, with grant support, the Ag & Water Quality Team helped local farmers install over 3,300 acres of cover crops. These cover crops prevented 333 tons of sediment runoff to our lakes and streams. We provided \$105,000 in cost-share dollars to help farmers try conservation practices.

## Species of the Month: Tree of Heaven (Ailanthus altissima)

#### Overview:

- 1. Can spread by sending out root suckers, or seeds.
- 2. Dioecious, meaning some trees are male, and others are female.
- 3. Spotted lanternfly strongly prefer trees of heaven over other potential host trees, making them an excellent place to look for SLF.

#### Identification:

- Winter is the easiest time of year to look for tree of heaven, its branches have smooth, reddish brown bark and reach straight up. It also has large, obvious leaf scars.
- 2. Its branches are smooth, with no hairs, unlike sumac which is hairy
- What looks to be a branch full of leaves is actually a single leaf, holding dozens of leaflets. The whole leaf can reach 4 feet in length.
  - You can differentiate this tree from staghorn sumac by Tree of Heaven's leaflets, which have an extra rounded bump at the base.
- 4. The leaves smell like rotten peanut butter when crushed.


